Planning for the 50<sup>th</sup> Anniversary Celebration began almost three years ago when a number of stakeholders from throughout the Wapakoneta community came together to outline plans to commemorate this significant anniversary observation.

The celebration kicked off in a big way on October 12, 2018 with a gala to celebrate the "First Man" movie premiere held in downtown Wapakoneta and has continued with programs and concerts and special events, all commemorating and celebrating Wapakoneta's connection to Astronaut Neil Armstrong and the space industry.

These events have been leading up to the 10-day expanded Summer Moon Festival, a collaboration among the 2019 Anniversary Celebration Committee, the Wapakoneta Area Chamber of Commerce and the Armstrong Air and Space Museum. Starting with a balloon rally on July 12 and continuing to a group "wink at the moon" on July 21, the festival has events sure to appeal to local residents and visitors alike.

## Hot Air Balloon Rally

The Auglaize County Fairgrounds will be the site of a 50th Anniversary Celebration Hot Air Balloon Rally. Balloon launches on July 12 and July 13 at 6:30 p.m. and a Night Glow event at 8:45 p.m. on July 13—they resemble giant Chinese lanterns.

It also has a selection of interactive exhibits, simulators, and an informative film in its Astro Theater. Festivities on the museum grounds include a 5k and 10k *Run to the Moon t*hat includes visiting NASA astronauts, space inflatables, interactive science experiments, rocket launches, and more.
